#### Footwear

In order to keep the Nursery carpet clean during the wetter weather, children will need to change into wellies before they use the Nursery garden. Please ensure they have a pair of <u>named</u> wellies to use each session. We do have space to store a pair should you wish to keep some wellies at Nursery. Children will be encouraged to change their own shoes so please help them by practising at home. It is a good idea to avoid shoes with laces unless your child can tie them independently. Children will also be required to remove their own shoes during our PE session and are encouraged to put their own socks and shoes on afterwards. Please avoid sending your child in tights on a PE day and remember to remove or cover any earrings. Long hair also needs to be tied back please.

#### **Tapestry**

Please let us know if you are unable to access your child's Tapestry account. Every form we had returned has been allocated an account so you can see your child's 'wow' moments in Nursery.

We still appreciate any observations from home – it's always nice to see the learning that occurs outside of Nursery.
